NEW YORK JETS' GARDNER VOTED 2022 PRO FOOTBALL WRITERS OF AMERICA ROOKIE OF THE YEAR AND DEFENSIVE ROOKIE OF THE YEAR; JETS' WILSON OFFENSIVE ROOKIE OF THE YEAR; ALL-ROOKIE TEAM ANNOUNCED

New York Jets cornerback **Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner**, who led NFL defenders with 20 passes defensed, is the **2022 Rookie of the Year** and the **Defensive Rookie of the Year**, chosen in voting conducted by the **Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA)**.

Jets wide receiver **Garrett Wilson**, who led all NFL rookies and set franchise records with 83 receptions for 1,103 receiving yards, is the **2022 Offensive Rookie of the Year**.

Gardner, the fourth overall selection in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Cincinnati, started all 17 games for the Jets and posted 20 passes defensed – the most among NFL defenders and the most by a rookie since 2015. He allowed only nine receptions for 65 yards in 130 coverage snaps in man coverage, according to NFL Next Gen Stats. He ranked in the top five among all cornerbacks in least receptions allowed (nine; second), least yards allowed (65; first), most passes defensed (eight; tied for first), completion percentage allowed (34.6 percent; second) and highest coverage success rate (76.9 percent; first) in man coverage. He was the first player since 2000 to record a pass defense in each of his first seven games as a pro, and had three games with three or more passes defensed, including a season-high four in Week 17 at Seattle. Gardner was one of four NFL players to record at least one pass defense in 12 or more games this season. He registered 75 total tackles (three for loss), two interceptions and one quarterback hit. Gardner was selected AFC Defensive Player of the Week in Week 7. He was the only rookie named to the 2022 PFWA All-NFL team, and he also was a PFWA All-AFC selection.

Gardner is the first Jets player selected as the PFWA's Rookie of the Year and, he is the second Jets player in franchise history to be named Defensive Rookie of the Year (DE **Hugh Douglass**; 1995).

Wilson, the 10th overall selection in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, played in all 17 games (12 starts) and set Jets rookie records for receptions (83) and receiving yards (1,103) and scored four touchdowns. He is the first Jets rookie to lead all NFL rookies in receptions and receiving yards since **Wesley Walker** in 1977. He had at least 75 receiving yards in eight games, the most among all rookies. Wilson is the only Jets rookie to record 100 or more receiving yards (two) in multiple games in the first eight weeks of the season, and he went over the 100-yard mark three times overall. He had a season-high 162 receiving yards, including a season-long 62-yard reception, on eight catches in Week 13 at Minnesota. He caught a season-high nine passes for 89 yards in Week 18 at Miami. Wilson was also one

of two rookies to have two touchdown catches in more than one game this season as he had a pair of TDs at Cleveland in Week 2 and against Chicago in Week 13.

Wilson is the first Jets player to be selected Offensive Rookie of the Year by the PFWA.

Seven teams – the Baltimore Ravens, Detroit Lions, Los Angeles Chargers, New England Patriots, New York Jets, Seattle Seahawks and Tennessee Titans – each had two All-Rookie selections. In all, 20 clubs are represented among the 27 players honored.

The All-Rookie team offense includes the San Francisco 49ers' **Brock Purdy** at quarterback, the Atlanta Falcons' **Tyler Allgeier** and Seattle's **Kenneth Walker III** at running back, the New Orleans Saints' **Chris Olave** and Wilson at wide receiver, Tennessee's **Chigoziem Okonkwo** at tight end, Baltimore's **Tyler Linderbaum** at center, the Chargers' **Zion Johnson** and the Las Vegas Raiders' **Dylan Parham** at guard and the Chicago Bears' **Braxton Jones** and the Dallas Cowboys' **Tyler Smith** at tackle.

The All-Rooke defense consists of defensive linemen Jordan Davis (Philadelphia Eagles), Aidan Hutchinson (Detroit Lions), George Karlaftis (Kansas City Chiefs) and Kayvon Thibodeaux (New York Giants), linebackers Devin Lloyd (Jacksonville Jaguars), Malcolm Rodriguez (Detroit) and Quay Walker (Green Bay Packers), Gardner and Seattle's Tariq Woolen at cornerback and Baltimore's Kyle Hamilton and the Houston Texans' Jalen Pitre at safety.

Chargers placekicker **Cameron Dicker**, Tennessee punter **Ryan Stonehouse**, Indianapolis Colts kick returner **Dallis Flowers**, New England punt returner **Marcus Jones** and Patriots special teamer **Brenden Schooler** make up the All-Rookie special teams selections.

The PFWA has honored an All-Rookie team every season since 1974.
